December 7, 2024 ERIC OSZUSTOWICZ GIVES A WHIRLWIND TOUR. Eric Oszustowicz will present both videos

and still photographs covering a multitude of subjects. The videos will portray the 2022 farewell charter trip of Boston's trackless trolleys, the New York Subway system, New Jersey Transit rail operations, Metro North, the LIRR, and Amtrak. Also included are videos of rail operations in Chicago and Philadelphia, plus nationwide freight operations. Still photos will be mixed in throughout. Vintage 1984–1999 views in both New York and Boston will round

out the show. The last 30 minutes will be completely devoted to the Boston area.

and CEO Jim Schantz will provide an update on recent progress at Seashore, including restoration efforts on a wide variety of cars. He'll also give a description of two major construction projects underway at Seashore, one to replace and expand the museum's oldest carbarn, South Boston. The second is to construct a year-round home for the Maine Central Model Railroad being relocated from Jonesport, Maine, to Seashore's campus. These projects are made possible by donations of over \$4 million to the museum.
